In addition, $C_{p\text{oil}} = 2282 \text{ J/kg.K}$ and $U = 416 \text{ W/m}^2\text{-K}$. Determine number of tubes, if outer diameter of tubes is 100 mm, length of each tube is 1.9 m and take correction factor as 0.85 **07**
